A MESSAGE FROM FATHER NOEL



Julia Baird in her column 'Talking Point' in The Age newspaper on Saturday, was rather cynical about the Prime Minister Scott Morrison publicly worshipping in church and now publicly praying with a prayer group in Canberra - that Australians were uneasy about their leaders expressing their faith in such a public way. She goes on to say that "Prayer is not meant to be a performance and Christianity should not be about the preservation of power, but interrogation of it." The writer then states that "people who pray are less likely to drink, be depressed, and more likely to be selfless in relationships" - she does not provide any evidence for these statistics. Julia Baird concludes on a wonderfully positive note. "Let's not scoff at prayer; millions are reaching to God and the good, hoping we can survive. Let's be gentle with each other."
