HOLY TRINITY PORT MELBOURNE – NOT OPEN YET

HTPM will not open just yet, either for private prayer or services (other than a funeral if required).

This week the Victorian Premier relaxed the Covid 19 restrictions a little. However he made it clear that while small religious services may resume, in general people ought to remain at home. Following this, a directive was sent out by the Archbishop of Melbourne – Dr Philip Freier, with reference to the possible limited opening of churches. The directive stated that if churches were to be used for private prayer, social distancing must be maintained and a limit of ten people at any one time. The directive also stated that:

- Cleaning needs to happen frequently;
- This is not an occasion for congregating socially;
- The use of common prayer books, Bibles etc. should be avoided;
- There ought to be no congregating or refreshments before or after;
- A contact list of all attending must be maintained. We suggest inviting parishioners to book in advance to attend. Once ten people are present, anyone else arriving must be refused entry;
- A logbook must be kept to record the cleaning of the church for the foreseeable future.
- Op shops to remain closed for the time being.
