"The Parish Council met on Thursday 4 June, social distancing observed of course!

There was discussion about the financial situation of the parish due to the loss of most of our income. Treasurer Liz reassured us that things are OK at the present but we will need to monitor the finances closely as the pandemic continues.

There was much discussion about the effects of the church closure and each member told of their own experiences over the past months. A positive picture was painted as to how each were dealing with the pandemic and it was very encouraging indeed to hear so many good news stories. As to the continued church closure, after much considered discussion it was decided that in light of the very complicated and compulsory precautions that the Diocese have imposed, we would not open the church at this time even though some restrictions have been lifted by the government. We want to take a cautious approach - so no church services, meetings or gatherings of any kind are to be held in the church until the Parish Council feels it is safe to do so. The precautions that the Diocese have set down are very demanding and a great deal of preparation will need to be made before we can offer worship again in our church building. The Opportunity Shop will not open, neither can home groups be held in our name as the legal status has not yet been determined. The Parish Council approached this issue with real care and concern for us all and I congratulate them on their sensitive handling of what is an extraordinary situation that we are now experiencing. The Parish Council will review all of this at its next meeting on Thursday 16 July 2020."




